

ALABAMA VOTERS' BILL OF RIGHTS

You have the right to vote and the proof is in your hands! If you think your voting rights have been violated, immediately contact an Election Protection volunteer toll free at:

1. **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO CAST YOUR VOTE** if you are already standing in line when the polls close. Polling places on Election Day will be open from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.
2. **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO ASK FOR SOMEONE TO ASSIST YOU IN VOTING** if you cannot read or write, or you are blind or otherwise disabled.
3. **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO REMAIN IN A VOTING BOOTH FOR AT LEAST FIVE MINUTES**, and **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO TAKE SAMPLE BALLOTS** with you into the polling place.
4. **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO ASK TO SEE A DEMONSTRATION** on how to use the machine before you vote.
5. **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO ASK A POLL OFFICIAL FOR A REPLACEMENT BALLOT** if you are voting on a paper ballot and make a mistake or “spoil” your ballot.
6. **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE BY REGULAR BALLOT IF YOU POSSESS ACCEPTABLE IDENTIFICATION**, and your name appears on the list of registered voters at your polling place. Voters are required to present acceptable ID to vote by regular ballot. Acceptable ID includes: current government-issued photo ID, employee photo ID, or student ID issued by an Alabama college or university, technical or professional school; **OR** a utility bill, bank statement or paycheck with the voter’s name and address; **OR** a hunting or fishing license, among others.
7. **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO CAST A SPECIAL PAPER BALLOT CALLED A “PROVISIONAL” BALLOT** if you do not have proper identification or if an election official cannot find your name on the list of registered voters for the polling place or you are challenged.
8. **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO BE FREE OF ANYONE TRYING TO INFLUENCE YOUR VOTE** within 30 feet of the polling place.
9. **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO UPDATE YOUR VOTER REGISTRATION RECORD AT YOUR OLD POLLING PLACE AND VOTE BY REGULAR BALLOT** if you have permanently moved to another *precinct in your county*. If, however, you have permanently *moved to another county*, you must register to vote in the new county because voter registration will not automatically follow you from one county to another.
10. **YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE IF YOU HAVE BEEN CONVICTED OF A FELONY THAT DOES NOT INVOLVE “MORAL TURPITUDE.”** Felony offenses that **do not** bar you from voting include assault and battery, violation of liquor laws, DUI, speeding, possession (not sale) of drugs, doing business without a license and trespass to land.
