

IDAHO VOTER'S BILL OF RIGHTS

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE – it's the law, and you have the proof in your hands! You'll notice letters and numbers after each of your rights listed below; those codes tell lawyers and poll-workers where to find the actual Idaho statute that protects your right to vote. These rights are guaranteed to properly registered and qualified voters. You have the right to take this Bill of Rights into the voting booth with you. If you feel your rights have been violated, please find an Election Protection volunteer to assist you or call toll free:

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO:

1. **VOTE IF YOU ARE IN LINE** at the polling place when the polls open at 8:00 A.M. or close at 8:00 P.M. Idaho Code § 34-1101
2. **VOTE BY REGULAR BALLOT WITHOUT PRESENTING ANY FORM OF PHOTO IDENTIFICATION** after your signature is verified unless you are a first-time voter who registered by mail and you have not previously provided photo identification to the supervisor of elections. § 34-410 and -1106
3. **REGISTER ON ELECTION DAY** if you submit both a photo identification and proof of residence. § 34-408A
4. **VOTE OUTSIDE THE POLLING PLACE** if you are physically disabled and unable to enter the polling place. § 34-1108
5. **REQUEST ASSISTANCE IF YOU CANNOT READ OR WRITE**, or you are blind or otherwise disabled. § 34-1108(2); § 34-2427; 42 U.S.C. § 1973aa-6
6. **VOTE IN SECRET** without being asked to reveal the name of any candidates you voted for or against. § 34-1110
7. **VOTE BY ABSENTEE BALLOT** if you are eligible to vote in Idaho. § 34-1001
8. **RECEIVE A REPLACEMENT BALLOT** from the election officials if you make a mistake on your ballot while voting. § 34-1109
9. **VOTE AFTER MOVING TO A NEW COUNTY** if you re-register in the new county or if you request an absentee ballot from your old county. § 34-413 and -408A
10. **VOTE AFTER BEING CHALLENGED** if you have subscribed to the elector's oath. § 34-1111
11. **VOTE WITHOUT ANY DISQUALIFICATION** if you have already served your sentence for a felony conviction. § 18-310(2)

12. VOTE WITHOUT BEING SOLICITED when you are within 100 feet of the entrance to the polling place § 18-2318

13. TAKE THIS BILL OF RIGHTS INTO THE VOTING BOOTH WITH YOU.
