EXERCISE YOUR RIGHT TO VOTE!

Attention Pennsylvania Voters! If you have questions or problems voting on **April 22, 2008** call: **1-866-OUR-VOTE (1-866-687-8683)**. To make the voting process easier, here are a few things to remember:

1. **Who votes in a Primary Election?** In Pennsylvania, only *registered* members of a political party may vote in the party's primary. However, all registered voters may vote for ballot question, constitutional amendments, or concurrent special elections that may be on the ballot. Please call **1-866-OUR-VOTE** to determine if you are a registered voter.
2. **Am I eligible to vote on April 22nd?** You are eligible to vote in Pennsylvania if you:
 - Are a United States citizen for at least one month.
 - Are at least 18 years of age.
 - Resident of Pennsylvania and your election district for at least 30 days.
 - Are not a convicted felon, or if you have been convicted of a felony AND you have completed your sentence.
3. **When and Where do I vote?** You can vote between 7:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. on **April 22, 2008**. If you are in line at 8:00 p.m., you have the right to vote. You must vote in your proper polling district, indicated on your registration card. If you do not have your registration card, please call **1-866-OUR-VOTE** to locate your proper polling district.
4. **I'm registered. How do I vote?** As a registered voter, you can vote by regular ballot at your proper polling district. You do not need your voter registration card and you do not need to show identification UNLESS you are a first time voter, or, if you moved and you are voting for the first time in that election district. Any of the following are proper forms of identification:

- Photo Identification (must be valid):
 - PA Driver's License or PENNDOT-issued ID Card;
 - ID issued by any other Commonwealth of Pennsylvania agency;
 - ID issued by the U.S. Government;
 - U.S. Passport;
 - U.S. Armed Forces ID;
 - Student ID; or
 - Employee ID.
- Non-Photo Identification (must include name and address):
 - Voter Identification Card issued by the Voter Registration Commission;
 - Non-Photo ID issued by the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania;
 - Non-Photo ID issued by the U.S. Government;
 - Firearm Permit;
 - Current Utility Bill;
 - Current Bank Statement;
 - Current Paycheck; or
 - Government Check.

5. **What if I can't cast a regular ballot, can I still vote?** As a registered voter, if you are not able to cast a regular ballot, you may cast a provisional ballot. You may cast a provisional ballot if:
 - Your name does not appear on the list of registered voters for that district.
 - You are a first time voter or voting in that district for the first time and you do not have proper identification.
 - You are voting at a location during hours extended by a federal or state court order.

If you cast a provisional ballot in wrong election district, the only part of your vote that will count is the portion of the ballot that you would have been able to vote for in your proper election district. BEFORE you cast a provisional ballot, please call **1-866-OUR-VOTE** to make sure you are in the right district.

6. **What if I need help?** If your registration card indicates you need assistance, or if you sign a Declaration of the Need for Assistance statement at your polling place, you may be assisted by a person of your choice, except for your employer or agent of your employer, someone from your union, or the judge of elections at your polling place, in the polling booth. In addition, in many districts throughout Pennsylvania, election materials are distributed in both English and Spanish, or a translator may be available. Please call **1-866-OUR-VOTE** to find out whether bilingual services are offered in your district.
