ORDER

This matter having come before the Court on the Complaint for Emergency Relief requiring the Baltimore City Board of Elections to extend voting beyond 8:00 p.m., the Court having considered the allegations contained in the Complaint, and it appearing to the Court that there were delays in opening polling places and that voters may not have had the opportunity to vote when they appeared in the polling place, and that the Court concludes that emergency circumstances exist in Baltimore City that will interfere with the electoral process in connection with the 2006 primary election and that emergency relief is required to protect the public interest and the integrity of the electoral process. The Baltimore City Board has consented to this relief. Accordingly, it is by the Circuit Court for Baltimore City, this 12th day of September, 2006,

ORDERED, that

1. All polling places within Baltimore City shall remain open until 9:00 p.m. Any voter in line at 8:00 p.m. is entitled to vote through the regular election process. Voters arriving after 8:00 p.m., and in line at 9:00 p.m., will be entitled to vote by provisional ballot in accordance with the Maryland Election Law.
