

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT MISSOURI'S IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR VOTERS

Missouri recently passed a new law that will require voters to show photo identification at the polls. However, this law is NOT in effect for the upcoming primary election on August 8, 2006.

YOU HAVE THE RIGHT TO VOTE A REGULAR BALLOT WITHOUT SHOWING PHOTO ID.

You may be asked for a photo ID at the polls, but you do NOT need photo ID. If you do not have a photo ID, you do NOT need to cast a provisional ballot. If you do not have photo ID, you do NOT need to fill out an affidavit to vote.

YOU DO NEED TO PROVIDE ONE OF THESE DOCUMENTS WHEN VOTING:

- Missouri or U.S. government-issued ID
- Student ID from a Missouri school of higher education
- Any other state-issued driver's license or state ID card
- Utility bill
- Bank statement
- Government check
- Paycheck, OR
- Government document with your name and address
